Hirock Ltd – Wheel washes

Te Matai and Linton quarries, Palmerston North

As part of Hirock quarries' commitment to addressing their social licence within local communities, they installed wheel washes at both their Te Matai and Linton quarries. At Linton Quarry they installed a self-designed wheel wash using on-site water, with the provision for recycling water if needed. At Te Matai Quarry they installed a commercial wheel wash using recycled water which is treated through a filter system with adequate storage to ensure the wheel wash does not require water from the plant.

Roundabout at Roydon Quarry

Fulton Hogan designed and installed a large roundabout at the entrance to their Roydon Quarry, removing a high crash intersection for Selwyn District Council. The roundabout limits the effect of trucks accelerating and merging into the flow of traffic. The roundabout includes pedestrian access to a walking track around the site and viewing platform of the site. Since the opening of the roundabout in late 2022 there have been no serious accidents at the intersection which previous averaged 2-8 crashes per annum.
