Quarry reclamation

Rehabilitated quarries provide an international benchmark for conservation. The network of ponds, lakes and streams are utilized for the captive breeding of critically endangered native species of birds, reptiles and fish.

Quarried land is also returned to productive farmland, providing pastoral stock grazing, that continues to become an income source.
